

Dr. Robert Barth

The American Medical Association (AMA) has listed Dr. Barth among its "internationally recognized expert authors". His work for the AMA included contributing to the Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment, and the Guides to the Evaluation of Disease and Injury Causation.

Dr. Barth has also served as faculty for the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons' workers compensation course for each of the past 20 years, as well as serving as faculty for the American Bar Association, the National Association of Workers' Compensation Judiciary, and many other scientific, legal, and governmental organizations.

His professional activities have also involved an intensive focus on...

- Causation Analysis for example, evaluating claims of
- work-relatedness
- Chronic pain for example, complex regional pain syndrome, reflex
- sympathetic dystrophy, neuropathic pain, etc.
- Brain injury for example, "concussion"
- Mental illness for example, posttraumatic stress disorder
- Disability evaluation
- And impairment rating.

Dr. Barth was named a Fellow of the National Academy of Neuropsychology for making "significant contributions to the science and profession of neuropsychology".

His education included post-doctoral fellowship training in the Harvard Medical School program at Massachusetts General Hospital, after pre-doctoral internship training in that same program.
